




In our Social Studies 9 class, we participated in a "Gallery Walk" activity for our project on the Physiographic Regions of Canada.





























MUSIC

The Concert Choir, Falcon Voices and our Women's Choir, Peregrine competed at the Yellowknife Music Festival held at Northern United Place.


They were awarded two Golds and a Silver for their three entries and received very positive feedback on their work!

So many exciting things happened in the music room and SJF this month!










NORTHERN STUDIES

Prior to this, students in northern studies researched traditional legends and stories of NWT beavers; while students in wildlife studied the zoology of begvers in the NWT.





Beaver Roast and Beaver Tail was served this month and they were a real big hit!












ACUTE CARE HEALTH EXPO


