It's already report card season! The time seems to be flying by! Judith shared how she began her career in math by creating software to design knitting patterns for her sweaters!

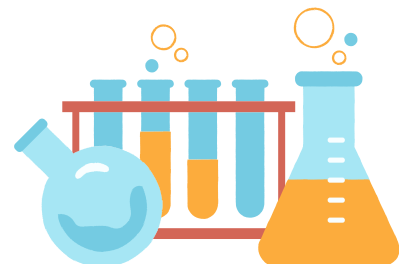
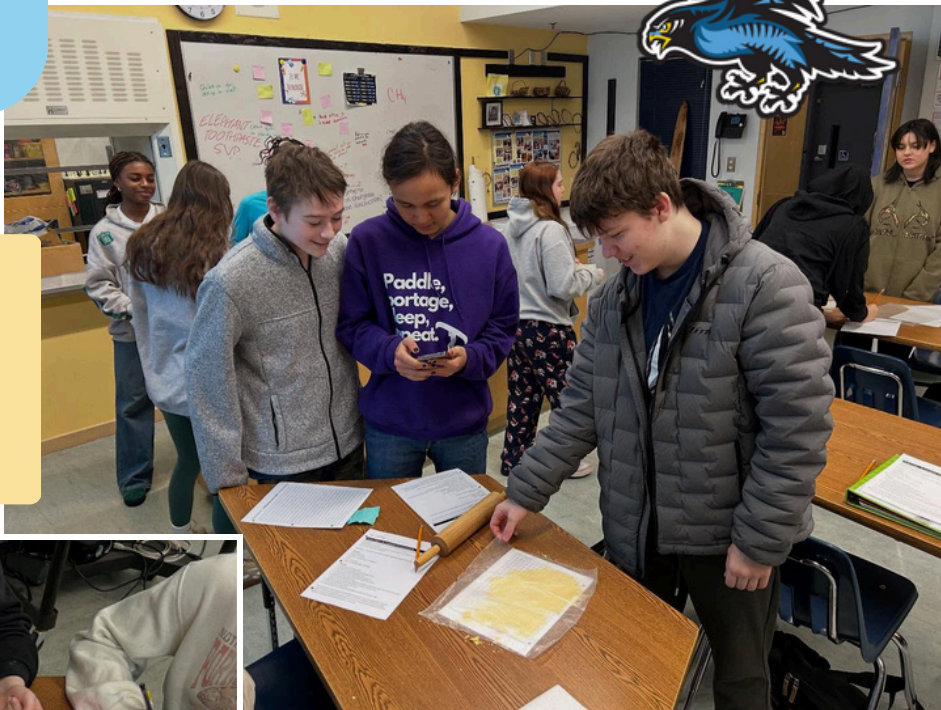






## SCIENCE

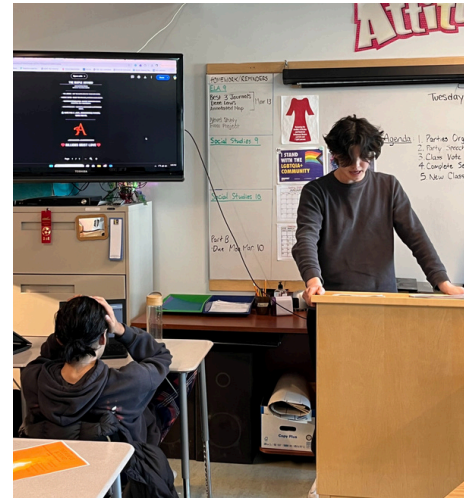
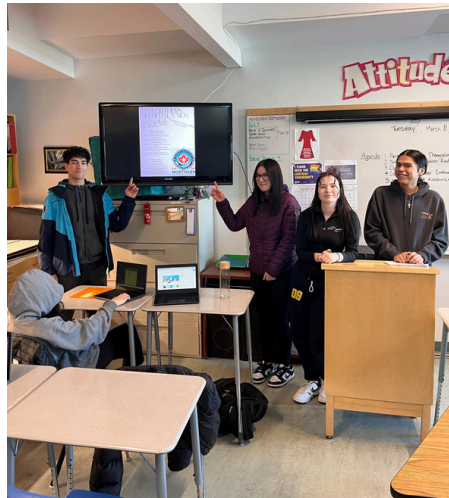
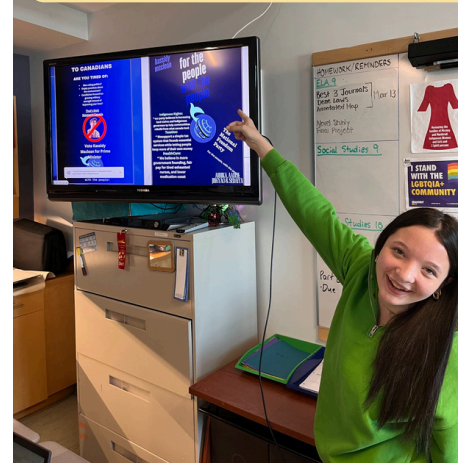
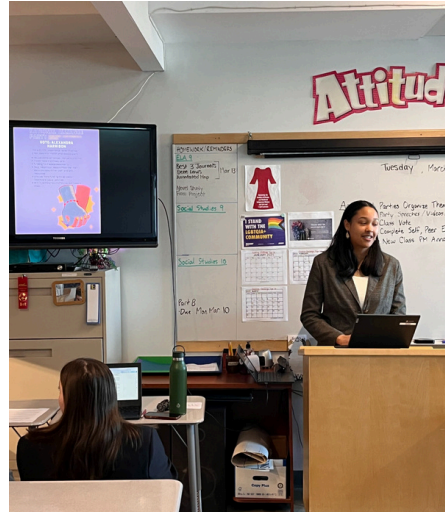




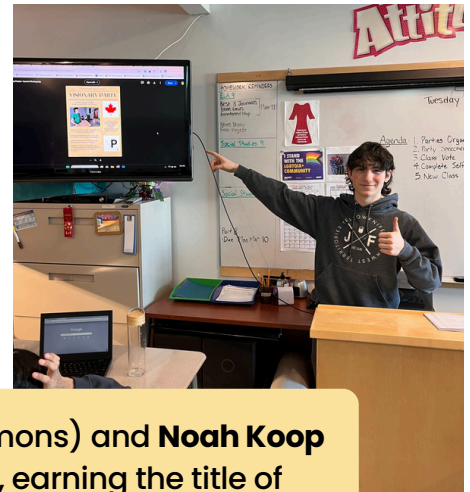
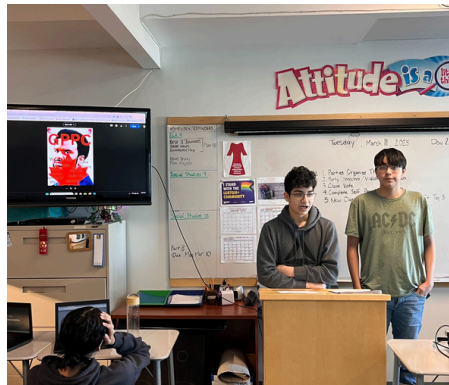
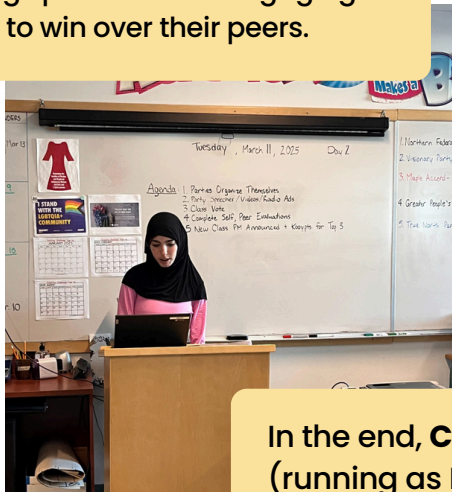


## SOCIAL STUDIES

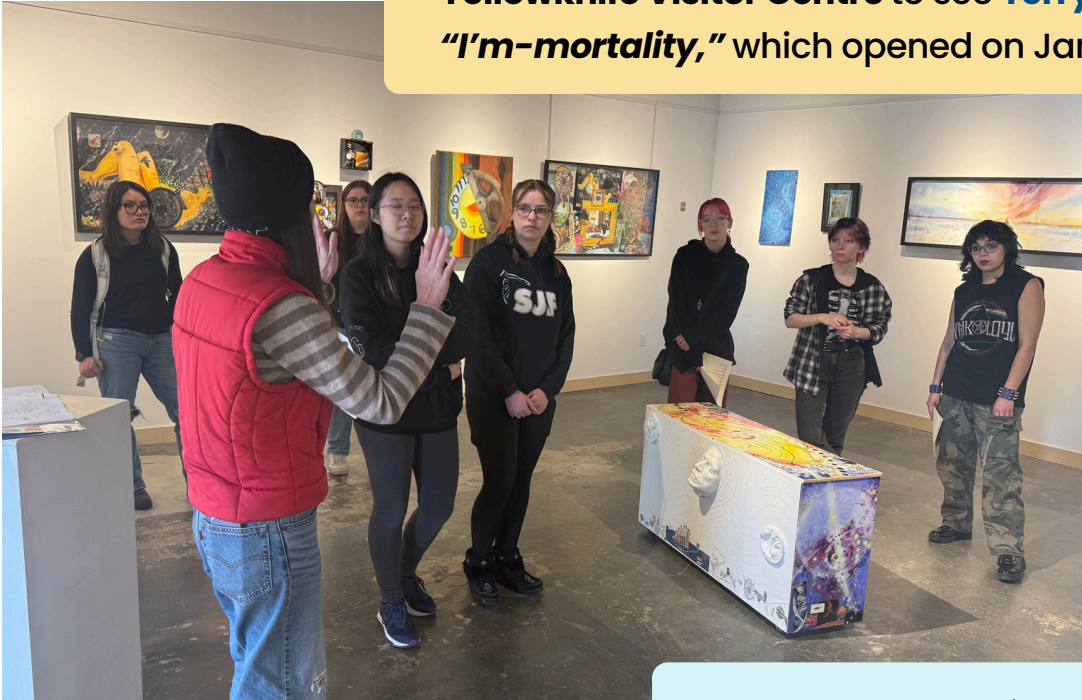

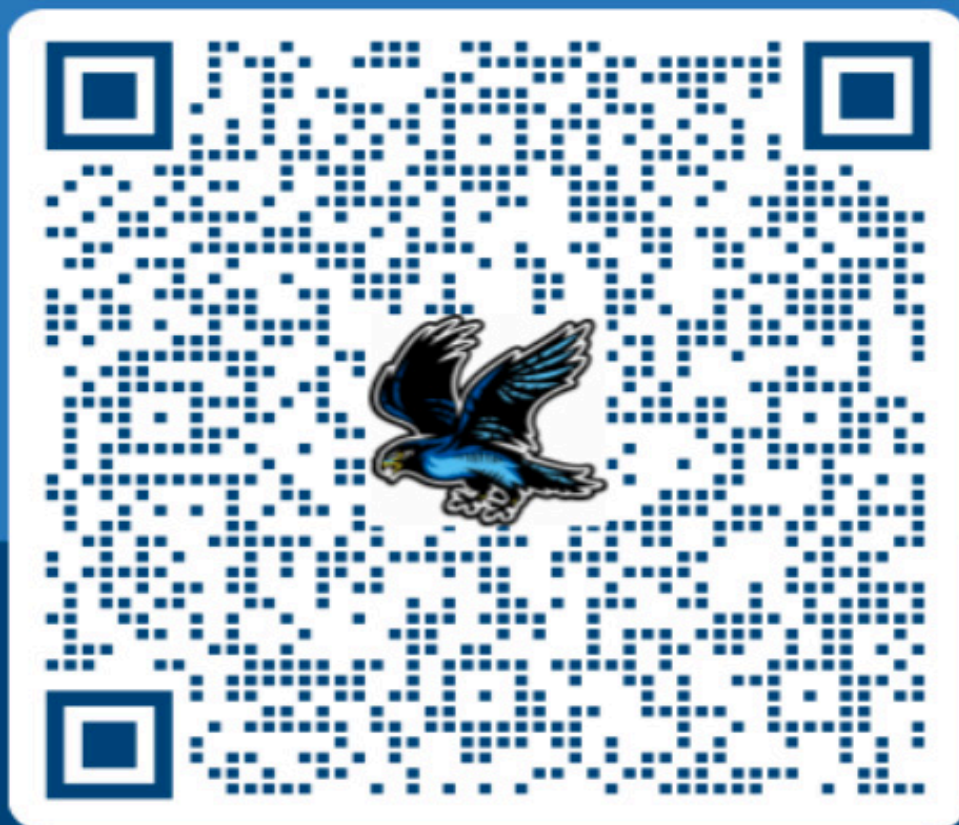
