

On September 15, students from the Sir John Debate Club and **Social Studies Club**, participated in the Surpreme Court of Canada visit to Yellowknife.




FRENCH

Open on weekdays from 8:15 AM to 4:00 PM Open during lunch


Library Guidelines and Expectations to keep the <u>library welcoming for everyone:</u>






