


The Perimeter Institute visited SJF and brought an incredible presentation: GoPhysics!

They manned a table to talk about the Ecosystems section of the action plan, and everyone who attended spoke highly of them and their understanding of their section.








O VISUAL ELEMENTS



Long Shot - the shot takes in the entire area, the viewer (camera) is at a distance

Medium Shot - the usual distance for a shot, often shows from the torso up on the subject, the viewer (camera) is at a comfortable distance from the subject.




