Background:

For those of you who are unfamiliar with the Reading Challenge, it was born as a competition between Sir John and St. Pat's during the 2020 COVID lockdown and then was the premier (and only) sporting event in 2020-21 and 2021-22.

Two years ago, we acquired an awesome trophy...and lost it to St. Pat's. Heartbreakingly, we still don't have our trophy back.



Here's how it works:

- Read a book.
- Scan the QR code (on posters) to record your book.
- Repeat many, many times!



In the end, whichever school has the highest average reading (number of books read divided by the number of participants) wins!





"Black Excellence: A heritage to celebrate; a future to build."



FINANCIAL LITERACY




Our Grade 9 Math classes welcomed a number of guest speakers who presented on a variety of topics dealing with Financial Literacy.




SCIENCE




