Because WMS...

- is committed to providing students with learning environments that are safe, positive, and inclusive
- respects students' rights to express themselves in the way they dress
- empowers students to make decisions that promote a positive sense of self and contribute to a respectful community

WMS will...

- respect a student's right to fairness, dignity, and respect
- NOT discriminate against students based on race, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, cultural observance, socio-economic status or body type

WMS expects that student attire will...

- Be functional (example: indoor gym shoes vs flip flops)
- Be comfortable (example: wearing clothes that allow you to move about freely)
- Be safe (example: wearing warm clothing in the winter)
- Be positive (example: wearing clothes free from discriminating hateful messages or illegal activities)
- Be private (example: wearing clothing that does not show private areas)



CELL PHONES & WEARABLES



Students are permitted to use their cell phones/electronics while on school grounds before school begins and after school. There will be no cell phone use during the regular school hours. Cell phones must remain in student lockers from 8:20-3:20 each day. Any student who uses a cell phone during class time must hand over the phone to the teacher and will be able to claim the phone at the end of the school day. Should there be repeated instances by the same student, the phone will be submitted to the office and a parent/guardian will be required to claim the phone.

All wearable electronics (ie. smart watches) must be in airplane mode throughout the school day.

The school will not be responsible for any stolen, lost, or damaged mobile devices or wearables.

In the event of an emergency during the school day, parents should call the school's main office at 867-873-5814 in order to speak with their child. Similarly, a child wishing to contact their parents/guardians can do so at the main office by asking to use the student-designated phone.

We are thrilled to announce the return of our weekly writing workshop, with Author in Residence, Amber Henry. The workshop is designed for aspiring young writers at École William McDonald Middle School. It offers a unique opportunity for students to explore their creativity, develop storytelling skills, and work toward publishing a piece in a collaborative anthology.

Workshop Highlights:

- Duration: 40-minute sessions, held once a week (Group A September-December and Group B January-June)
- Class Size: 10-15 students, ensuring personalized attention and support.

Anthology Contribution:

• Each student will produce a piece of writing to be included in a collective anthology at the end of the course. Which will be available in the school library for fellow students to read.

What to Expect: The workshop is designed in two semesters:

• Students will receive instruction on creative writing fundamentals, genre exploration, storytelling techniques, drafting, and revising.

Throughout the program, students will be encouraged to think outside the box and build confidence in their writing abilities.

Why This Workshop? Creative writing teaches kids how to think critically, articulate ideas, and express themselves in new ways. Our goal is to guide students through the writing process from brainstorming to revision, ultimately helping them develop a deeper understanding of storytelling while honing their personal voices.

Whether you are passionate about fantasy, sci-fi, mystery, or any other genre, this workshop offers the guidance needed to bring ideas to life!


JOANNE TOWNSEND - "MRS. TOWNSEND"
