Entry/Exit Protocols:

- students arrive at the building and needs to enter the door code #2005 or call (867) 920-4960
- staff record the student's attendance: arrival and exit times
- work areas: student carousels, large desks, and tables available in our classroom
- Chromebook, copier machine, printer, calculators, all school supplies are available for all students on site
- washrooms are within the workspace
- when the student is leaving the workstation will be cleaned off

Students:

Enrollment into this program requires the following process completed by each student and approved by SJF Administration.

- Either online or in-person SJF registration form needs to be filled out
- Academic advisor or guidance counselor appointment be made to review goals and plan
- Students must be under 21 years old. Students older than this age category will not be accepted into the program until they meet with SJF school administration.
- Registration deadlines depend on the level of the course - ie. grade 12 diploma courses must follow the date set by the GNWT.
 - o Semester 1 courses deadline - November 1st
 - o Semester 2 courses deadline - March 1st
 - o Requests for registrations beyond these dates must be approved by SJF Administration.

Program Expectations:

- Students must attend once a week in-person for at least one hour
- Students are to complete the course by the end of the semester
- Students can only be enrolled in one course at a time

- Students wanting to carry a course over to the next semester must seek approval by administration
- Students wanting to take more than one course must seek approval by administration
