Daily Symptom Screening Tool for Students, School Staff and Early Childhood Care Workers

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Initial Screening Questions

- Are you required to self-isolate due to travel from outside the NWT? Is anyone in your household required to self-isolate due to travel outside of the NWT?
- Have you had close contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
- Have you been advised to isolate or self-isolate by ProtectNWT or a healthcare provider in the past 14 days?

If the answer is **YES** to one or all of the questions above, please stay home and contact public health for next steps.

If the answer to all questions is **NO**, move to Step 2.

Do you have ANY of the following symptoms?



Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing



New or worsening cough



Fever



Loss of sense of smell or taste



Generally feeling unwell



Chills



Musala asha



Fatigue or weakness



Sore throat



Congestion or runny nose



Headache



Diarrhea, nausea or vomiting



Loss of appetite



Abdominal pain



Skin changes or rash

If the answer is **YES**, please stay home and move to step 3 for guidance on arranging a healthcare assessment.

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
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
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International Human Rights Day










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Student Spotlight

Student Services Roles

Student Support & Communications Liaison

The role of the Student Support & Communications Liaison is to assist in daily operations of the Student Services Department. They assist students with booking Academic Counsellor appointments, printing documents (validation statements, schedules, report cards) and managing students' cumulative files. They coordinate presentations and workshops from outside organizations such as universities and colleges. They deliver communications to students and parents as well as create monthly newsletters and update the school website and social media accounts.

Academic Counsellor

The role of an Academic Counsellor is to support students in their academic pathways and courses through advising, scheduling, and planning. The Academic Counsellors follow students throughout their high school years to ensure that they are set up to successfully complete high school graduation requirements in order to receive their high school diploma and also have the courses they need to apply for their desired Post Secondary programs. They assist students in applying for apprenticeships, College, University, travel programs, specialized programs, student financial assistance, etc.

The Academic Counsellors are the first point of contact for student needs and help facilitate the students' needs whether it be advising in reference to academics, housing, food support, personal counseling and beyond. All students are assigned an Academic Counsellor who is paired up with a Program Support Teacher.

Program Support Teacher

Program Support Teachers take a strength based approach to supporting teachers and students. They are experienced and knowledgeable teachers who provide direct collaborative support to classroom teachers as they develop instructional strategies to meet the needs of students. Specifically, the PSTs focus on developing and supporting the implementation of instructional strategies; problem-solving; coaching; mentoring: co-teaching: modelling promising practices, engaging in activities that directly support classroom teachers, and providing direct support to students.

Child and Youth Care Counsellors (CYCCs)

CYCCs offer mental health counselling sessions to youth and their families. They are graduate-level counsellors trained to work with various mental health concerns and behavioural difficulties that may come along with such concerns. They recognize the importance of identifying and fostering resiliency in youth and work from a trauma-informed lens. The CYCCs can provide guidance for navigating other mental health services in the territories or other support services that may best support the well being of the youth. The CYCCs also offer parent consultations as needed. During the school year, they will be based primarily in the school, but in order to align with the needs of youth and families, services can be offered by the community based CYCC at the GogaCho Building.



- 2. Scroll to the bottom of the opening page to the section called "Report Card to print (PDF)"
- 3. Beside "Period Attendance" select the "Term".
- 4. For January 2022 report cards, click on "S1 2021- 2022"
- 5. Once you have selected the correct term, click the blue "Period Attendance" button.
- 6. A PDF of the November report card will pop up, and you can view, print, and/or save a copy.
