

Kevin Koe

Though born in Edmonton, Kevin spent his teenage years learning to make world class shots at the Yellowknife Curling Club. Introduced to curling by his parents, Kevin is the oldest member of the Northwest Territories royal family of curling with both his brother Jamie and sister Kerry representing the NWT at Canadian national championships on several occasions. In fact, it was alongside Jamie, at the 1994 Canadian Junior Curling Championships that Kevin had his first breakthrough at the national level.

Despite entering the tournament as underdogs, based on the fact that they were from the NWT, Kevin lead team NWT to an unprecedented 2nd place finish. Though the tournament ended in heartbreak for team NWT, the shot-making ability and national success Kevin experienced was a sign of things to come. Following his graduation from École Sir John Franklin High School in 1994, Kevin moved to Alberta to attend the University of Calgary. Kevin's next major breakthrough was in 2010 when he won his first of five provincial titles in Alberta.

That same year Kevin won his first National Championship and his first World Championship. Kevin would go on to win two more National Championships (2014, 2016) and another World Championship in 2016.
