Indigenous language and culture education provides all students with an opportunity to experience and learn about the First Peoples of the NWT and their rich heritage.

Mildred Hall School (MHS) allows students to experience Indigenous culture and traditions through culture camps. In Indigenous language and culture programs, students explore and learn about traditional knowledge, language and life.

Meaningful learning experiences for students engage the whole child and motivate a love of learning and the lifelong pursuit of knowledge.

Located in the heart of downtown Yellowknife, MHS provides students with a welcoming learning environment.

"Strength in Diversity" is a focus at Mildred Hall. Students are encouraged to build upon their strengths, feel success, and celebrate their unique abilities and talents. Our Eagle Awards celebrate these strengths twice yearly.

Enrichment, gifted and student support programs as well as differentiated instruction is used to match program delivery to individual student needs and strengths.
