

School options

All teachers offer extra help during lunch and after school hours. Each teacher sets their own times and students are responsible for communicating with their teachers and finding out when they are available to help. It is up to the students to use this extra support.

Our Program Support Teachers may have a limited list of grade 12 students that can offer tutoring during the school day. Students can meet with their Program Support Teachers to discuss if this would be a good option and if there is availability. Payments would be arranged directly to the student tutor by the family.

If you know of any Sir John students interested in tutoring, they can connect with their teachers and/or Program Support Teacher.

The science classes have been busy to winter!


The Science 10 class did a biology field trip to Niven, a dominos lab, and an escape room!


















Blanket Excercise


