Intensive French (IF) is an approach in which French is taught with a concentrated approach. During the first half of the year, about 70% of instruction is in French and in the second half, about 25% is in French; the rest of the curriculum is taught in English. Mathematics instruction is taught in English through the entire year.

The Post-Intensive French (PIF) program for Grades 7 and 8 continues to help reinforce and develop French communication skills using the IF approach. In the PIF program for Grades 7 and 8, 20% -25% of the day is taught in French.

Range Lake North (RLN) is an inclusive school. Our staff works hard to ensure that all children feel welcome and successful. Students work at various levels and follow various programs. To meet the broad range of needs, special talents and abilities of all learners, RLN uses research-based best-practices and differentiated instruction.

RLN emphasizes teaching students mathematical concepts with real world connections. Numeracy is developed with a student centered, problem solving approach. Students build upon their understandings and learn new strategies so that mathematical concepts become more meaningful to them.
