2023 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES:

École Sir John Franklin High School

City of Yellowknife Citizenship Scholarship (\$500)

Presented to a graduating student who excels in the four categories of scholarship, leadership, service and courtesy.

Diavik Diamond Mines Inc. Scholarship (\$1000)

Presented to a graduating student who has been accepted into a post-secondary program. Priority will be given to students pursuing careers in Engineering, Natural Sciences, Social Sciences, Commerce or Finance. Proof of acceptance into a post-secondary program at a recognized post-secondary institution must accompany your application. DDMI's values and principles of active partnership, respect, development and excellence are key considerations for this scholarship.

Yellowknife RCMP All Ranks Mess Scholarship (\$500)

Presented to a full-time grade 12 graduating student who demonstrates responsibility and honesty, has a high academic standing, shows leadership within the school community, and respects the rights and beliefs of others. The student should show a commitment to physical fitness and a substance-free lifestyle. Preference will be given to a student who intends to continue his/her education in the area of law enforcement, has a strong interest in the justice system, or justice related fields.

YK#1: The Metro Huculak Educational Scholarship (\$1000)

Presented to a graduating student who is entering post-secondary studies within the next year and who intends to pursue studies in Education. The recipient of this award shows good community involvement, leadership in the school, and has an interest in education in the North.

Bullocks Bistro Culinary Scholarship (\$1000)

Applicants must show an interest in the culinary arts. Preference will be given to students pursuing culinary arts at a post-secondary school, who have participated in Skills Canada cooking and/or baking competitions or who were actively engaged in the École Sir John Franklin High School Culinary Arts Program throughout their years at high school.

The Brick's Falcon Leadership Scholarship (\$1000)

Presented to a graduating student who exemplifies what it is to be a "Falcon". Eligible students must maintain strong attendance, demonstrate a solid work ethic and make a positive impact on the Sir John School Community. They are caring and thoughtful individuals who lead by example.

City Cabs Engineering Scholarship (\$700)

Presented to a graduating student who intends to study Engineering/Sciences. The student has demonstrated high academic standing and community service.

<u>Sanda Pon Memorial Scholarship (\$1000)</u>

The family of Jim Hong Pon awards a scholarship in the memory of Sanda Pon to a Sir John Franklin graduate to assist them in their pursuit of a career in education.

Doreen Cleary Indigenous Award (\$500)

Awarded to an Indigenous graduating student who intends to pursue post secondary studies in University or College or pursuing a trade. Preference will be given to a student who demonstrates a strong work ethic, good relationship building and critical thinking skills.

Bernie Straker Trades Scholarship (\$500)

Presented to a high school graduating student who shows an interest in the trades. Preference will be given to students pursuing a trade at a post-secondary school or through an apprenticeship program, who have participated in Skills Canada or who were actively engaged in the École Sir John Franklin High School Career and Technology/Trades program and courses throughout their years in high school.

Canadian Tire Community Services Scholarship (\$2000)

Presented to a student who contributes to the community and shows good citizenship. The student must be pursuing post-secondary education or trades training in any field and exemplify traits of generosity, compassion, kindness, teamwork and ethics. The applications should include their past activities that reflect the guiding values set out above.

Robin Sproule Award (\$500)

Presented to a graduating student who excels in sports, who puts in the work to be the best they can be, who displays leadership and sportsmanship and who has heart, tenacity and grit.

Marilyn Morrison Fine and Performing Arts Scholarship(\$500)

Marilyn Morrison was an elementary music and art teacher with YK1 until her sudden passing in 2017. She sang in many local productions, taught singing lessons, conducted the Yellowknife Choral Society and was active in her church choir as a soloist and choir director. She loved to paint and spent her career encouraging students to make music and art. This scholarship is intended for a Sir John student who is an active performing or visual artist, has interest in continuing their art as a hobby or career and who has shown involvement in the Yellowknife Arts Community and/or leadership in their school community.

Enough Talk, Hurry Up and Do It Already Arts Scholarship (\$1000)

(Administered by the Yellowknife Community Foundation)

Established in 2006 by Dustin Milligan to assist École Sir John Franklin High School graduating students pursuing post-secondary studies in the performing arts, film, music or writing.

To be eligible, individuals must be grade 12 students at École Sir John Franklin High School who have been accepted into a post-secondary program for the performing arts, film, music or writing for the following school year. Preference will be given to applicants that demonstrate a strong work ethic, talent in their chosen field and a passion for drama, film or writing-related studies and activities both in school and in the community.

Applications should be submitted **directly to the Yellowknife Community Foundation by May 15, 2020.** Be sure to include links to portfolio material or in writing. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
