Dear Parents/Guardians,

On November 10th, we had the pleasure of having Lieutenant– Colonel Steve Thompson join us virtually from his base in the Middle East to recognize our day of Remembrance on November 11th. Mr. Thompson's family lives in Yellowknife and his children and extended family are part of the YK1 family. He shared with us his role in the "War on Terrorism" as a member of the Canadian Military overseas. He was tasked with the coordination of the evacuation of over 130,000 people from Kabul, Afganistan. He reminded us of those that sacrificed their lives in the past and currently for the freedoms that we enjoy today.
